CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS

American Academy of Pediatrics

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I.

Name

The name of this organization shall be AMERICAN ACAD-EMY OF PEDIATRICS.

ARTICLE II.

Incorporation

Section 1. The American Academy of Pediatrics is incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois.

Section 2. The corporation shall have a corporate seal which shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the words "Corporate Seal" and "Illinois."

ARTICLE III.

Objects and Powers

- Section 1. The object of the Academy shall be to foster and stimulate interest in pediatrics and correlate all aspects of the work for the welfare of children which properly come within the scope of pediatrics. The Academy shall endeavor to accomplish the following purposes:
 - (a) To establish and maintain the highest possible standards for pediatric education in medical schools and hospitals, pediatric practice and research;
 - (b) To perpetuate the history and best traditions of pediatric practice and ethics;
 - (c) To maintain the dignity and efficiency of pediatric practice in its relationship to public welfare;
 - (d) To promote publications and encourage contributions to medical and scientific literature pertaining to pediatrics:

none of which objects is for pecuniary profit.

Section 2. The American Academy of Pediatrics shall have all of the powers of a corporation, organized not for pecuniary profit. as are now or shall hereafter be conferred by the statutes of the State of Illinois.

Section 3. The general management of the American Academy of Pediatrics shall be vested in an Executive Board, having the same duties and powers as the managers or directors of a duly incorporated society.

ARTICLE IV.

Membership

Section 1. The members of the Academy shall consist of and be known as Fellows; they shall be elected in accordance with the bylaws of this Academy and with such additional rules as the Board may from time to time adopt.

Section 2. The Fellows shall be authorized to use the letters

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after their names on professional cards, in professional directories, and in professional publications.

Section 3. Fellows shall have the right to vote at general and special meetings of the Academy and to hold office therein.

ARTICLE V.

Associates

Section 1. Provision shall be made in the by-laws for the election of Associates.

Section 2. Associates shall receive publications of the Academy and participate in its clinical sessions, but they shall not be permitted to vote or hold office and they shall not be members of the Academy.

ARTICLE VI.

Amendments

Amendments to this constitution shall first be submitted in writing to the Executive Board in time to be submitted to the membership by letter, postal card, or telegram, at least thirty days before the annual business meeting. A two-thirds vote of the members voting at the annual business meeting shall be necessary to adopt an amendment.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I.

Officers

Section 1. Officers. The officers of the Academy shall consist of the following:

President Vice-President Treasurer Secretary Executive Board.

Section 2. Election of President and Vice-President. The President and Vice-President shall be elected at the first annual meeting of the Academy. Immediately following the next succeeding annual meeting the Vice-President so elected shall then succeed to the presidency. At the same next succeeding annual meeting and at all subsequent annual meetings a Vice-President shall be elected who in turn shall succeed to the presidency immediately after the annual meeting held next following the annual meeting at which he was elected to such vice-presidency.

Section 3. Duties of President and Vice-President. The duties of the President and Vice-President shall be those ordinarily performed by such officers; in the event of the death, resignation, or absence of the President or in the event of his inability to act from any cause the Vice-President shall act as President. This shall not affect the Vice-President's succeeding to the office of President as provided in Section 2 of this article.

Section 4. Secretary and Treasurer. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be appointed by the Executive Board for a term of one year, or until their successors are chosen, and their duties shall be determined and outlined by the Executive Board: the Executive Board may in its discretion appoint one Fellow to fill both offices.

Section 5. Security Bonds. The Secretary and Treasurer and such other officers and employees as may be charged in any manner with the handling of the funds of the Academy shall each be required to furnish a surety bond upon such terms and conditions and for such amounts as shall be prescribed by the Executive Board.

Section 6. Nominating Committee. The President shall within one month following his induction into office appoint a nominating

committee consisting of a member from each of the regional districts bereinafter defined. No member of the Executive Board shall serve on the nominating committee.

Section 7. Duties of Nominating Committee. The duties of the nominating committee shall be to nominate candidates for the elective office of Vice-President and for vacancies on the Executive Board. The selection of nominees for the Executive Board shall be made after due consideration of suggestions from Fellows in their respective regional districts in which such vacancies occur.

Section 8. Notification of Nominations. The list of nominees for Vice-President and for vacancies on the Executive Board shall be submitted to all of the Fellows in writing at least one month before the annual meeting, and the election of all nominees shall be by a majority of all the members voting at its annual business meeting.

ARTICLE II.

Executive Board

Section 1. Number. The Executive Board shall consist of the President. Vice-President, and one member from each of the regional districts of which the Academy is composed.

Section 2. Term of Office. At the first annual meeting of the Academy the regional members of the Executive Board shall be elected. The terms of office of the respective members thereof shall be as follows: Region 1, one year: Region 2, two years: Region 3, three years; Region 4, four years: Region 5, five years, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Section 3. Subsequent Elections. At each subsequent annual meeting a successor shall be elected for a term of five years from the regional district the term of whose Executive Board member shall have expired. No member shall serve for more than two succeeding terms.

Section 4. Regions. The regions of which the Academy is composed shall be designated by number and geographical location, and the respective regions shall comprise the following groups of states, districts, or provinces, as the case may be, and bear the following numbers:

ARTICLE III.

Powers and Duties of the Executive Board and of Regional Committees

Section 1. Powers and Duties. The powers and duties of the Executive Board shall be those ordinarily performed by a board of directors of a corporation, namely:

- (a) To transact all business arising in the interim between annual meetings of the Academy and required to carry out the objects of the organization:
- (b) To manage, control and conserve the property interests of the Academy:

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- (c) To fix initiation fees and annual dues of Fellows:
- (d) To adopt from time to time rules and regulations for the election of Fellows and Associates supplementary to the regulations contained in the by-laws;
 - (e) To create, appoint, and direct all standing committees:
- (f) To elect editors and committees on publication for all publications of the Academy;
- (g) To call meetings of the corporation not already provided for;
- (h) To make arrangements through the Secretary for annual and special meetings of the Academy, the Annual Clinical Session, and other meetings:
 - (i) To elect Fellows and Associates; and
- (j) To transact all business not otherwise provided for that may pertain to the Academy.
- Section 2. Regional Committees. The Executive Board shall appoint a committee in each region consisting of Fellows residing therein and composed of at least five members, but there shall not be more than one member thereof appointed from any one state, district, or province. The incumbent member of the Executive Board from such region shall be chairman of such regional committee during his term on the Executive Board, and as such chairman he shall be counted as a member at large from that region.
- Section 3. Duties of Regional Committee. The duties of each regional committee shall be as follows:
- (a) To pass on the qualifications of all applicants for Fellowships and Associateships in its district and report the findings or recommendations to the Executive Board;
- (b) To meet or confer at least once a year, and to stimulate interest in the activities of the Academy in its region;
- (c) It shall consider problems arising in its region and bring them before a joint meeting of all regional committees to be held just prior to the annual meeting of the Academy, and the committees thus meeting shall submit reports to the Executive Board for consideration at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IV.

Qualifications of Fellows and Proposals for Fellowships

Section 1. Qualification. A candidate to be eligible as a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics must meet the following qualifications and requirements:

- 1. A minimum of five years in pediatrics.
- 2. Evidence of fundamental training.
- 3. Productivity in one or more of the following:
 - (a) Teaching
 - (b) Investigate work
 - (c) Clinical studies
 - (d) Publications (contributions to medical and other scientific literature).
 - (e) Public activities related to pediatrics.
- 4. Clinical experience and standing as determined by Fellows in his region.
- 5. Governmental activities related to pediatrics shall be considered as proper qualification for Fellowship.
- Section 2. Proposals for Fellowship. The candidate's name shall be proposed and seconded by Fellows in his region, not officers. Applications for Fellowships shall be first sent to the regional committee of the region in which the candidate resides. A nomination for Fellowship must be accompanied by a written statement made by both the proposer and the seconder defining the candidate's particular qualifications as defined in sub-section 3 of Section 1 of Article IV. Further, the name of the candidate shall be sent to each Fellow in the candidate's region with a request for comments as to his fitness. The proposer must be prepared to add such further information as may be requested by the proper regional committee.
- Section 3. Credentials. The credentials of candidates for Fellowship shall be considered first by the regional committee, which committee shall within ninety (90) days report to the Executive Board recommending election, deferment, or rejection.
- Section 4. Notification of Candidates. Successful candidates shall be so notified immediately after their election, and they shall be urged to attend the next succeeding annual meeting, when Fellowships shall be conferred.

Section 5. Addresses of Fellows. It shall be the duty of each Fellow to keep on file with the Secretary an address to which all notices required by the by-laws, rules, or regulations of the Academy may be sent. The mailing of any notice to such address shall be conclusive upon such Fellow.

ARTICLE V.

Associate Fellows, Their Qualifications, Proposal and Election

Section 1. Qualifications. Those persons who, because of valuable service in any of the fields allied to pediatrics, are qualified to render assistance to the Academy in the accomplishment of its purposes, may be elected to Associate Fellowship.

Section 2. Election. The name of any candidate for Associate Fellowship shall be proposed by a Fellow and endorsed by at least one other. The proposal shall be accompanied by a written statement of the qualifications of the candidate. Such proposal and written statement of qualifications shall be submitted to the Executive Board, and election to such Associate Fellowship shall be by a majority of that Board.

Section 3. Fees and Dues of Associate Fellows. Associate Fellows shall not be required to pay membership fees or annual dues.

ARTICLE VI.

Modification of By-laws in Relation to Fellows and Associates

The Executive Board shall be empowered until the 1932 annual meeting, on recommendation of regional committees, or when deemed by the Executive Board to be expedient, to modify or make special rulings on individual cases not covered by the provisions of the by-laws.

ARTICLE VII.

Publications

The Executive Board shall have full power in regard to fostering and promoting publications and contributions to medical and other scientific literature in connection with the promotion of the objects and purposes of the Academy.

ARTICLE VIII.

Annual and Special Meetings

Section 1. Annual Meeting. A meeting of the Academy shall be held each year to be known as the Annual Meeting, at which time the conferring of Fellowships shall take place and a presidential address shall be delivered.

Section 2. Time and Place of Annual Meeting. The time and place of the annual meeting shall be designated by the Executive Board, and the Secretary shall make all arrangements for such meeting, and he shall give at least ninety days' notice thereof by mail to each Fellow and Associate.

Section 3. Transaction of Business. The annual meeting may be held in any region of which the Academy is composed, and at such annual meeting members of the Executive Board, whose terms shall then expire, and elective officers of the Academy shall be chosen, and all business of the Academy coming properly before such annual meeting may be transacted.

Section 4. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Academy may be called by the Executive Board for such time and place as it may designate, provided ninety days' notice thereof by mail shall have been given to the Fellows: such notice shall designate the purpose or purposes thereof, and no business shall be transacted other than that specified in the notice.

Section 5. Quorum. Ten Fellows of the Academy shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at the annual or at any special meeting of the Academy.

ARTICLE IX.

Meetings of the Executive Board

Section 1. Time and Place. The President of the Academy shall designate the time and place of the meetings of the Executive Board, but each member thereof shall be given by the Secretary fifteen days' notice of the time and place of such meeting. Additional meetings of the Board may be called upon written request of three or more members thereof, and like notice shall be given of such meeting by the Secretary.

Section 2. Quorum. Four members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE X.

Termination of Fellowships and Associateships

Section 1. Expulsion. The Executive Board shall have power to expel Fellows and Associates for any cause which in their judgment shall be deemed sufficient, but an affirmative vote of at least four members thereof shall be necessary for such expulsion. A Fellow or Associate may be expelled only after he has had notice in writing of the charges preferred against him and a hearing had thereon. Upon such expulsion all his rights and privileges as such Fellow or Associate shall be forfeited and terminated

Section 2. Resignation and Death. All rights and privileges of a Fellow or of an Associate shall terminate upon his death or resignation.

ARTICLE XI.

Delinquency

A Fellow or Associate shall become delinquent after failure to pay dues for two years. If he continues to be delinquent for thirty days after notification by the Secretary his name shall be dropped from the roll and all of his rights and privileges as such shall thereupon cease and terminate.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendments

These by-laws may be amended by a majority vote of those voting at any annual or special meeting of the Academy, provided. however, that any such proposed amendment shall first be submitted to the Executive Board for its consideration, who shall then submit its report on such proposed amendment with its recommendations to the Academy.
