

What can patients expect when they visit UCLA?

Staying healthy now is just as important as it ever was. All of our more than 180 medical clinics and hospitals have rigorous infection prevention policies in place, including:

- Pre-screening for patients, visitors, and staff before they enter a medical clinic or hospital, which includes a temperature check and symptom monitoring
- Visitor restriction policies (currently only one parent or caregiver is allowed)
- Universal masking for everyone over 2 years old
- Physical distancing in all shared spaces
- Enhanced disinfection and sterilization procedures in exam rooms and on high-touch surfaces, such as elevator buttons and digital screens
- Diagnostic COVID-19 testing for patients 1 to 2 days before surgeries and procedures
