The premier journal in human population studies and the flagship publication of the Population Association of America, *Demography* will be published by Duke University Press (DUP) and transition to open access beginning in 2021.

We need the support of stakeholders—demographic research centers and departments, foundations, top contributing institutions, global consortia, and libraries—to invest in a sustainable, community-based funding model to ensure the long-term viability of *Demography*.








Demography publishes the highest quality, original research of scholars in a broad range of disciplines, that include anthropology, biology, economics, geography, history, psychology, public health, sociology, and statistics. The journal encompasses a wide variety of methodological approaches to population research. Its geographic focus is global, with articles addressing demographic matters from around the planet.

In the subject category of demography, *Demography* is the highest cited journal based on the 2019 InCites Journal Citation Reports, with more than 7,900 citations. Since 2015, *Demography* citations have increased by more than 50%. It is ranked number three in impact factor (3.080) out of 27 journals. In 2019, researchers downloaded 400,000 articles.

Our goal, along with our sponsoring partners, is to cover the journal's publishing costs and our financial obligation to the Population Association of America during the first five years of publication. We would also like to develop an open access endowment to offer this model to other publications looking to transition to OA.
