PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Graduates of Seneca's Library and Information Technician program earn an Ontario College Diploma.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma with a majority of senior credits at the College Preparation (C), University Preparation (U) or University/College Preparation (M) level or Mature Student Status (age 19 or older)
- Grade 12 English: ENG4(C) or ENG4(U)

Note: Although not required for admission, keyboarding, basic computer skills and strong communication skills are desirable.

WHAT YOU'LL LEARN

The focus of the program is practical and experience-based, whether in class, working independently on assignments, or in field placements. Your educational experience includes a high proportion of time using computers and software specific to the library and information industry. The curriculum is based on the Guidelines for the Education of Library Technicians produced by the Canadian Federation of Library Associations and changes continuously to reflect the latest developments in the working world. The skill set at the completion of this program prepares graduates to take their place in the workforce and be productive immediately.

YOUR CAREER

Library technicians work in various environments such as business corporations, professional firms, cultural organizations, financial institutions, schools, and public libraries. Their jobs require them to be service-oriented, work with minimal supervision and adaptable to change. Library technicians, along with librarians, are the mainstay of libraries, and have found positions in the information industry.
