LATE QING AND REPUBLICAN-ERA CHINESE NEWSPAPERS

The first half of the twentieth century began with the demise of



China's last imperial dynasty, the Great Qing, and ended with the foundation of the People's Republic of China in October 1949.

The Late Qing and Republican-Era Chinese Newspapers collection provides invaluable perspective on this critical period. The press of more than twenty cities is represented, spanning the Chinese mainland and the entire half century. The collection provides researchers a richly comprehensive perspective on Chinese life, culture, and politics throughout the collapse of the Qing Dynasty, the years of provisional government and civil war, and the birth of the People's Republic.

The collection currently contains over 20 titles and over 445,000 pages of content but will ultimately grow to include hundreds of titles and 500,000 pages by Spring 2020.

MIDDLE EASTERN & NORTH AFRICAN NEWSPAPERS



From the Ottoman Empire to the Arab Spring, the countries of the Middle East and North Africa have stood at the crossroads of history.

The Middle Eastern & North African Newspapers collection includes publications from across this dynamic region, providing unique insights into the history of individual countries, as well as broad viewpoints on key historic events from the late nineteenth century through the mid twentieth century.

The collection comprises out-of-copyright, orphaned content and is predominantly in Arabic, but also includes key titles in English and French. New titles will continue to be added to the collection, which will ultimately include over thirty newspaper titles and approximately 500,000 pages of content.

CRL members will also receive access to five in-copyright titles from the region: *Jumhūrīyah* (الجمهورية, Egypt), *Filastīn* (فلسطين, Israel), *Al Akhbar* (الاخبار, Lebanon), *Riyāḍ* (الرياض, Saudi Arabia), and *Dustūr* (الدستور, Jordan). Non-CRL institutions will be able to purchase these additional archives; more details to come in Spring 2020.

INDEPENDENT AND REVOLUTIONARY MEXICAN NEWSPAPERS



The Independent and Revolutionary Mexican Newspapers collection traces the evolution of Mexico in a tumultuous time, during the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The collection provides rare documentation of the dramatic events of this era and includes coverage of Mexican partisan politics, yellow press, political and social satire, as well as local, regional, national and international news.

Most of the titles in the Independent and Revolutionary Mexican Newspapers collection are from the Nettie Lee Benson Latin American Collection, a renowned research library at the University of Texas at Austin for area studies on Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean, and the Latino presence in the United States.

The Independent and Revolutionary Mexican Newspapers collection currently includes over 800 titles and will ultimately include approximately 1,000 titles from Mexico's pre-independence, independence and revolutionary periods (1807-1929).

COMING SOON! IMPERIAL RUSSIAN NEWSPAPERS



The Imperial Russian Newspapers collection chronicles 189 years of Russian history. From Peter the Great's founding of the Russian empire, through the empire's expansion during Catherine the Great, the abolishment of serfdom by Alexander II, the tumultuous years of Nicholas II, and everything in between. The collection will include no less than 500,000 pages and feature core titles from Moscow and St. Petersburg, complemented by regional newspapers across the vast Russian Empire.

The Imperial Russian Newspapers collection was facilitated by the outstanding bibliographic work done by librarians and scholars in major Russian libraries, primarily the Russian National Library's Newspaper Division, which is one of the largest newspaper libraries in the world.
