Committees

AAP Members of the 23 National Committees develop many of the policy statements published by the AAP and author books based on their area(s) of expertise. Under the direction of the Board of Directors, and with the assistance of the National Office, they work to achieve the Academy's goals and objectives. The Committee Forum Management Committee (CoFMC) oversees the activities of the AAP committees and acts in a consulting capacity to the Board of Directors.

The Committee Forum (CoF) is comprised of the chairpersons from all national committees. It serves as a forum for discussion of policy development issues. All national committees are appointed by the Board of Directors. Appointments are based on member expertise; if all equal, then appointments are based on interest, gender, ethnicity, district representation, and chapter activity. All committee vacancies are posted at aap.org/lead.

Sections and Councils

Pediatricians, pediatric medical subspecialists, pediatric surgical specialists, and non-physician clinicians do remarkable things for children through their involvement with the AAP.

Sections were developed within the AAP for members who share a pediatric medical subspecialty, surgical specialty, special area of interest, or career stage. Sections cultivate ideas and develop programs within their subspecialty or special interest that improve the care of infants, children, adolescents, and young adults. Members within each section guide AAP policies, clinical reports, and practice standards and act as AAP representatives to other organizations. Each section presents leadership opportunities through an elected executive committee and many appointed sub-committees.

Councils represent the evolution of committees and sections working in the same field into an integrated structure. Like sections, they generate policy, create educational programming and resources, develop and promote advocacy initiatives, support translation of policy and education into practice, and integrate and evaluate these efforts to maximize impact.

AAP Partnerships Changing the World

National Center on Early Childhood Health and Wellness aap.org/ncechw

The Academy is leading the National Center on Early Childhood Health and Wellness (NCECHW). This is a 5-year cooperative agreement that will provide \$33.4 million to establish a center to support child health and wellness for Head Start/Early Head Start and child care programs nationwide. The NCECHW is a collaborative effort between the Administration for Children and Families Office of Head Start and Office of Child Care and the Health Resources and Services Administration Maternal and Child Health Bureau.

The Center supports early care and education (ECE) programs to provide safe, healthy, nurturing environments for the children and families they serve. ECE programs, especially Head Start, support health and wellness through adherence to well child visits, linkages to medical providers, and tracking immunizations. The Center works to increase collaboration between pediatricians and early childhood programs such as ECE in order build better health outcomes for children. Life Support Programs

Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) aap.org/nrp

The Neonatal Resuscitation Program[®] (NRP[®]) course conveys an evidence-based approach to care of the newborn at birth and facilitates effective team-based care for healthcare professionals who care for newborns at the time of delivery. NRP utilizes a blended learning approach, which includes online testing, online casebased simulations, and hands-on case-based simulation/ debriefing that focus on critical leadership, communication, and team-work skills. Join the over 430,000 NRP providers in developing optimal resuscitation skills by better understanding the causes, prevention, and management of mild to severe neonatal asphyxia.



AAP Project ECHO® aap.org/projectecho

Project ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) is an innovative telementoring program designed to create virtual communities of learners by bringing together healthcare providers and subject matter experts using videoconference technology, brief lecture presentations, and case-based learning, fostering an "all teach, all learn" approach. Participants are engaged in the bi-directional virtual knowledge network by sharing clinical challenges and learning from experts and peers.

The Academy serves as an ECHO Superhub, which is a training arm of the ECHO Institute. In this role, the AAP trains and supports partner organizations to serve as hubs. The Academy has leveraged the ECHO model to implement a variety of pediatric-specific programs and offers Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits and Maintenance of Certification (MOC) Part 2 and 4.
