Turn your poster or presentation into a published manuscript.

Reach all your neonatal colleagues and share your expertise in *Advances in Neonatal Care* (ANC), the official journal of the **National Association of Neonatal Nurses** (NANN)

- Plan your manuscript using the abstract for your presentation or poster. In many ways, a big part of your outline is already done.
- Consider what section of our journal your manuscript fits best. If you are unsure of the most appropriate section, please contact us for a recommendation.
- Check out the author guidelines for ANC and the specific author guidelines for the section you have selected. Make sure you update the literature to support your work. New work on your topic may be available since you completed your abstract or began your initial work.
- Fill in the remainder of the content in your manuscript. Think about how your work is important to neonatal practice. What are the next steps or future research that must occur to strengthen the work you have already done? Include these in your discussion and implications for practice.
- Ask a colleague to read your manuscript and give you feedback prior to submission; this is often an effective way to get great feedback and ensure your submission is excellent.
- **Submit your manuscript at www.editorialmanager.com/anc.** Expect that you will refine, revise, and resubmit your work. Publication is a process, and we will assist you along the way.

By sharing your work and expertise, you are advancing neonatal science and improving outcomes for the infants and families we meet each day. By sharing your work, your colleagues will be encouraged by your expertise, and together we can make an even bigger difference in the care of infants and families.
