As landscape architects, we know diversity is essential for healthy ecological systems. It is also vital for landscape architecture practices. Whether you are male, female or non-binary, are just starting your career or are a firm leader, WxLA will share valuable and tangible strategies to create a gender just practice.

- 6. Uncover the role that men can play in advocating for and creating gender just workplaces including identifying privilege, developing active ally skills and standing with women against bias and discrimination.
