Overview

On June 12, 2016, a violent tragedy shook Orlando when a gunman opened fire on the crowd at Pulse nightclub. In response to the community's desire for a safe and comfortable space to reflect on the lives lost and effected by the event, the landscape architect has worked hand-in-hand with the onePULSE Foundation in the implementation of an interim memorial and the international design competition process.

The Pulse Memorial and Museum will be a sanctuary of quiet reflection dedicated to honoring the loss of innocent life and remembering the tragic attack at Pulse Nightclub. This session will describe the complex process of mending a community following a tragedy.

She has been named one of NBC Universal's 2018 Change Makers, received the 2018 Point Foundation Leadership award, recognized as Ally Ambassador of the year for the 2018 LGBT – Allies Diversity Summit and 2017 LGBT Champion of Equality at the Harvey Milk Diversity Awards.
