Outpatient Therapy Services

Intensive Day Treatment

- Following illness, injury or surgical intervention for patients making rapid progress or requiring intensive training for new skills
- 1-3 weeks of 3-5 days per week with >2 disciplines (PT, OT, SLP);
 3-6 hours per day; located in McWane PT&OT Department


Transitional Services

- Following illness, injury or surgical intervention while making continuous progress with focus on transitioning to home and community-based services
- Outpatient services with >2 disciplines (PT, OT, SLP); 2-3 times per week; 3-4 hours per day; located in McWane PT&OT Department

Community-Based Services

- For patients with acute or chronic conditions who are making ongoing progress, following through with a home program or preparing to return to school or community-based activities
- Frequencies based on need from one to several times a month
- Located at Children's Outpatient Therapy Services on 3rd or at an outpatient facility of choice in or near patient's hometown
