- Contraindications
- Use of compression therapy systems is not recommended in the presence of any of the following:
- Known or suspected deep vein thrombosis or pulmonary embolism
 - During the inflammatory phlebitis process
 - Acute infection of the affected limb
 - Decompensated cardiac failure
 - Congestive heart failure
 - Severe arteriosclerosis or ischemic vascular disease
 - Any circumstance where increased venous and lymphatic return is undesirable
 - Due to the movement of fluids in the body when using the system, exercise caution when using on patients with heart disease
 - High pressure is not recommended for patients who have peripheral occlusion disease
 - The abdominal area should not be treated during pregnancy

Indications for use

- Chronic Wounds/Venous Disease
- Lympha Press® Intermittent Pneumatic Compression (IPC) treats the underlying condition to:
- Decrease recurrence and reduce wound healing time¹
 - Reduce venous stasis
 - Increase flow velocity in the deep veins²
 - Address dysfunction of the muscle pump

- Edema
- Lympha Press manages swelling caused by excess fluid trapped in body tissues and activates the lymphatics. Helping the lymphatic system to adequately drain fluid is imperative to prevent:
- Progressive infection
 - Wound complications
 - Hospitalization

- Primary Lymphedema
- Hereditary lymphedema is genetic and generally caused by malformation of the lymph vessels and/or lymph nodes.

- Secondary (Acquired) Lymphedema
- The most common form of lymphedema, it is caused by disruption to the drainage of the lymphatic system that occurs with trauma. Lympha Press effectively manages:
- Post-mastectomy edema
 - Swelling and pain after injury or surgery
